



Microsoft Word Injunction starts in 3 days - January 11, 2010

Toronto, January 8, 2010 – Today, Microsoft filed a petition with the Federal Circuit Court of Appeals seeking to have the i4i vs. Microsoft case, regarding Microsoft Word, reheard by that Court. This follows a December 22, 2009 judgment by the Court of Appeals that upheld both the jury’s verdict and the August 11, 2009 Final Judgment by The Honorable Judge Leonard Davis that ruled in favor of i4i and found that Microsoft had wilfully infringed i4i’s U.S. Patent No. 5,787,449.

Loudon Owen, i4i Chairman, says, “This next step of seeking a rehearing was anticipated. We continue to be confident that we will prevail.” Mr. Owen continues, “In the meantime, the injunction against Microsoft goes into effect in three days, on Monday January 11. We look forward to continuing to build i4i’s business now that Microsoft is obligated to comply with the terms of the injunction. i4i stands ready to work with the wide range of customers that require this custom xml functionality.”
